In war-torn 1990s Tbilisi, Achiko, born in a criminal district, gets caught up in the world of drugs. Now 42, trapped in lifelong addiction, he finds fleeting comfort in daily methadone therapy alongside his brother Goga (44). Achiko shares a special bond with his niece Elene (8) who struggles due to her father's addiction. Elene's trust sparks hope in Achiko. He wishes to break free from methadone and rediscover his passion for drumming. During daily drives to the methadone center, beneficiaries reflect upon Georgia's aspirations for EU membership amidst the war in Ukraine. As Georgia defines its future, Achiko feels more and more abandoned, losing access to the family home. Almost as a form of therapy, Achiko occasionally visits his childhood friend's, the filmmaker's home. The filmmaker, having battled addiction, explores resilience, vulnerability and hope amid Georgia's evolving landscape, questioning if the system binds users to methadone, limiting true change.

SYNOPSYS

Placekeepers is a feature length observational documentary that follows the dwindling community of villagers in Tusheti that face winter in the Caucasus Mountains after the only road to their region closes up for up to seven months each year. Filmed over a period of three years, Placekeepers will weave individual narratives into a broader community portrait that covers the breadth of villagers' experiences in the winter period. Our protagonists' narratives will unfold across three seasons, as we follow their experiences through the mass exodus of their community in autumn, through to the isolated winter months, until the reopening of the road in spring, when the region is reconnected with the rest of the world.

In June 2023, Georgian filmmakers united to fight for independent Georgian Cinema, as the government took control of the sole funding source for filmmakers - the Georgian National Film Centre - and began displaying signs of censorship. Competitors and sometimes rivals, filmmakers with different tastes and worldviews united as one. Protesting during eight months in various forms every day, they became a family, preparing for the 2024 elections - the only chance to change the government and restore independent cinema. Standing alongside her colleagues, Mariam Chachia took her camera and followed the protest movement from day one, seeing it as the most effective way to combat censorship by creating a film about it. But what if the elections do not fulfill their hopes? How long can filmmakers remain activists and boycott filmmaking? What is the future for Georgia and its culture if the government retains power, and what will happen to the filmmakers' family?
